Mistakes help us to learn!

I agree that making mistakes is the only way kids can move forward. At the start of class I always I ask my students if the word failure is a good or bad word. They always answer BAD. I tell them that the word FAIL just stands for First Attempt at Learning AND that frustration just means that you are on the verge of learning something AMAZING. By the end of my class students have a different answer when I ask them. I love the idea of teaching more about successful people who've made mistakes and learned from them. This past year (3rd gr) we read Snowflake Bentley about Wilson Bentley's life long journey to becoming a snowflake collector.

Confidence is key. Educators allow students to be free and confident.

Snowflake Bentley is a great book to about trying and trying again! Love it!

Amanda is the TRUTH!

So impressed that the teachers featured in the video are equally as excited about building students' soft skills like "confidence" and "empowerment" as they are about academic growth.

I use Bloomz the same way Moria, the kids love showing their parents what they are working on, especially if it is something that they can't take home until completed.

Standards integration and alignment with the Arts is so valuable. Yes, it takes more time to plan, but the enrichment is rewarding.
