	Medium	A form of something being used.

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

Lesson: Mondrian-Inspired Linear Equations	Term	Definition
	Coordinate Plane	A plane containing two perpendicular axes (x and y) intersecting at a point called the origin.
	Intersecting Point	A point in space where lines intersect.
	Solution of a System	An ordered pair of numbers that makes both equations true.
	System of Equations	Two linear equations that are solved together at the same time, and are graphed.







The first 10 Amendments to the United States Constitution spelling out Americans' rights in relation to the US government.


Constitution
